153 candidates from all over the globe are nominated for the prestigious Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award (ALMA) and among them the Zambian Lubuto Project. The award of five million Swedish kronor (Kwacha 3,069,000,000) is the world's largest for children's and youth literature and the second-largest literature prize in the world.

ALMA sends a signal to the world that children and youth literature is worth millions and that children and youth are invaluable.
